Municipal Notes

COUNCIL NEWS

We've been experiencing quite the erratic weather in the month of March! From warm temperatures to cold with high winds and a mix of snow. The Dryden Drag Race Association hasn't been able to catch a break unfortunately and were forced to cancel their March event. We hope they have some better luck in the future and are able to host a drag racing event at our airport property.

Mayor Griffiths, Councillor Pilkey, and our EDO visited Mayor Black and Community Development Officer Heather Gropp of Sioux Narrows Nestor Falls on March 12th. Mayor Black and Heather were gracious enough to show us around their municipal office, outdoor recreational facility, tourism centre, and spend the day with us chatting about municipal topics. The basis of the trip was to view and learn about the process they went through from start to finish of their new outdoor recreational facility including the grant work required to fund the project and all the work included in making it a success. With that being said, we learned a lot more about other municipal topics like tracking asset inventory and landfill operations. We owe a big thank you to Mayor Black and Heather for taking the time to host us and provide us with such helpful information.

We've sent out a Request for Proposal for Banking Services for the Municipality to different banks in our area at the end of March. Proposals will include information with costs/fees detailed and targeted towards the current banking needs of the Municipality as well as costs for us to transition into some new services. A few of the new services we're asking to be explained/ detailed in the RFP include using a direct deposit payroll system, having point of sale machines for debit/credit payments at the office, and more online payment abilities. There is no guarantee we'll be switching or updating our services; however, we feel it's time to assess new options and see if we can modernize our banking services in a cost-efficient manner that works for our staff and residents.

We are happy to say that we've been approved and accepted funding from FedNor for the costs of having an Economic Development Officer for another 3 years! For the last 3 years of funding from FedNor, salary and travel were covered by FedNor at a rate of 90%. For the next 3 years, funding will gradually decrease from 90%, 75%, and 50%, the goal is to complete the development projects we've started these past few years so we can increase our revenues and eventually afford the full-time position.

Staff departments submitted their 2024 budgets at the end of March. Our plan is to meet in the month of April and finalize the 2024 budget. As everyone knows costs continue to rise. Municipal governments are not allowed to operate in a deficit like Provincial and Federal governments do; municipalities do not receive enough provincial support to maintain infrastructure/downloaded costs which continues to be an issue every year. The Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) have made this a point to be discussed with provincial officials each year. AMO has recognized the current system is not sustainable for municipalities and something needs to be done. Issues like this are brought up as we discuss our 2024 budget, we need to make sure we are adequately allocating money aside for future infrastructure replacements costs while also maintaining current infrastructure needs, modernizing our services, and working towards completing our development projects. Once finalized, Council will hold a meeting to present the 2024 budget like every other year. This is a great opportunity for residents to view and ask questions about where your tax dollars are going and what projects are planned for the vear.

Economic Development:

It's crazy to think 3 years has already gone by. I've been learning a lot in my time being here and would like to thank all the community members who have provided input and help for work being done since I've started. I was very happy to see the FedNor funding officially came through and hope to have some of these development projects actually completed this time around. Red-tape and bureaucracy have been frustrating to deal with. For example, we still have yet to complete our V-Bay North Cemetery Expansion. This project is simply 7 acres of vacant unused Crown Land adjacent to our V-Bay North Cemetery. This is land that will never be used by the Crown nor does it have any monetary value, yet here we are still waiting for the disposition to go through. Final survey deliverables were sent at the end of February, this coming after a survey completed by a licensed Ontario Land Surveyor was submitted to MNRF at the end of June in 2023. Projects like this are a perfect example of flaws in the MNRF Crown Land disposition process.

We were unfortunately declined for two grants in March. The first was the Emergency Preparedness Grant where we applied for costs to purchase a genesis telescopic ram and battery e-pack for our Volunteer Fire Department. The other grant was the Ontario Trillium Foundation Resilient Communities Fund. We were declined funding to complete a feasibility study at the Eagle River Rink to assess options of a concrete surface and roof structure.

Our goal now is to take a similar approach as Sioux Narrows Nestor Falls (SNNF) and apply to FedNor and NOHFC for the costs to install a concrete surface and roof structure at the rink. There is still a lot of work to be done, and going this route requires us to have a good idea of what roof structure we'd be using, size of the concrete base, water supply system, and engineering costs involved. Initial thoughts would be to decrease the size of the rink. Right now it's around 80ft x 200ft, one idea would be using a similar size as SNNF and having an 80 ft x 150ft ice surface. The facility would be multi-functional with pickleball courts and potentially basketball nets in the summer. Please keep in mind this is all preliminary thoughts and nothing is set in stone, and there still has to be a lot to discuss on this potential project.

There should be more updates on Ely Lake and our Old Blue Lake Road Subdivision next month. The end of March was the soft deadline for communities to respond to MNRF's duty to consult letter sent in February; however, any comments that come in after March must still be considered. Our plan is to have a meeting mid-April with MNRF and see if any comments have been submitted and our next steps for the project. Machin has to complete a stage 1 archeological assessment for the Ely Lake area, and we will not be completing this until after we've heard any comments from the duty to consult communities. We're having our public meeting for the Blue Lake Road Subdivision on April 2nd at 6:00pm in the Council chambers. All comments will be recorded confidentially for the application and we'll try and address any concerns at the meeting as we'll be joined virtually by our municipal planner. After this meeting we are one step further into progressing this project.

The tenders will then be opened in public on the same day as soon as possible after 3:00 p.m. at the Machin Municipal Office, 75 Spruce Street, Vermilion Bay.

According to the last returned assessment roll, the assessed value of the land is \$200,000.

Minimum tender amount: \$67,406.53

Tenders must be submitted in the prescribed form and must be accompanied by a deposit of at least 20 per cent of the tender amount, which deposit shall be made by way of a certified cheque/bank draft/ money order payable to the municipality.

Except as follows, the municipality makes no representation regarding the title to or any other matters relating to the land to be sold. Responsibility for ascertaining these matters rests with the potential purchasers. The assessed value, according to the last returned assessment roll, may or may not be representative of the current market value of the property.

Pursuant to the Prohibition on the Purchase of Residential Property by Non-Canadians Act, S.C. 2022, c. 10, s. 235 (the "Act"), effective January 1, 2023, it is prohibited for a non-Canadian to purchase, directly or indirectly, any residential property, as those terms are defined in the legislation. Contraventions of the Act are punishable by a fine, and offending purchasers may be ordered to sell the residential property.

The municipality assumes no responsibility whatsoever for ensuring bidders/tenderers comply with the Act, and makes no representations regarding same. Prospective bidders/tenderers are solely responsible for ensuring compliance with the Act and are advised to seek legal advice before participating in this sale.

Transfers of properties that contain at least one and not more than six single family residences and are transferred to non-residents of Canada or foreign entities, are subject to the Province's Non-Resident Speculation Tax (NRST).

This sale is governed by the *Municipal Act, 2001* and the Municipal Tax Sales Rules made under that Act. The successful purchaser will be required to pay the amount tendered plus accumulated taxes and any taxes that may be applicable, such as a land transfer tax and HST.

The municipality has no obligation to provide vacant possession to the successful purchaser.

ALL Outdoor Fires MUST Follow MNR Regulations April 1st – October 31st Phone # to Report Forest Fires: 310-FIRE (310-3473)

Regulations that MUST be followed:

Ignite the fire no sooner than 2 hours before sunset and extinguish it no later than 2 hours after sunrise Conditions allow fire to burn safely until extinguished

You take all necessary steps to tend, control and extinguish the fire

Do not have an open fire in a restricted fire zone

The only material that can be burnt is: grass, wood, brush and wood by-product

Using an incinerator:

Ensure the incinerator is an enclosed device constructed entirely of non-combustible material. Cover the incinerator with a screen having a mesh size of not more than 5 millimetres. Keep the incinerator at least 5 metres from any forest area. Keep the incinerator at least 2 metres from any flammable material.

Safe outdoor burning tips:

Keep your fire small

Keep burning pile less than 2 metres in diameter and less than 2 metres high.

An area of grass or leaves can be burned if the area is less than one hectare (2.5 acres) and the length of the flaming edge is kept to less than 30 metres (100 feet).

Choose a safe site

Keep burning piles at least 2 metres from other flammable material so the fire doesn't escape by running along the ground away from the pile or burn area.

If burning an area of grass or leaves, make sure the area is surrounded by a fire-proof boundary, such as a road, wet ditch or ploughed ground.

Stay with your fire

You must tend the fire, keep it under control, and extinguish it before leaving the site.

A responsible person must be present to tend the fire at all times, even if it is contained in an incinerator.

Keep adequate tools and water on hand to control the fire if it begins to spread.

Put the fire out – since coals can smoulder for hours and hot embers and sparks can be blown by the wind:

Dispose of used charcoal or ashes in a pit.

Drown hot coals thoroughly, stir them and drown them again until cold.

If you start a fire, you are responsible for putting it out. MNR can fine you and hold you responsible for the cost of putting out the fire and for any property damage.

Contact Machin Volunteer Fire and First Response if need a smoke/CO alarm, fire safety information, or if interested in volunteering with the department. Volunteer applications can also be picked up at the Municipal Office. No experience required.

Planning towards our Municipality of Machin Volunteer Spring Road Clean-Up Program is underway. This initiative is in-line with many of the goals outlined in the Municipalities' 2023-2027 Strategic Action Plan Update and the 2023 Community Improvement Plan (CIP); visually enhancing and promoting our community image through general beautification. We are proud of where we live and want to showcase it to others as a great community.

In previous spring Clean-Up events, volunteers have done an excellent job on the cleaning of our roads and highways within the Municipality resulting in a significant visual improvement. We would like to commend the efforts of these volunteers and of all residents that clean-up local roads on their personal time, thank you!

Clean-up will be scheduled on Saturday April 20th as part of Earth Day celebrations (alternate weather day Saturday May 4th). The Municipality will supply garbage bags for Municipal roads and Emcon Services Inc. will supply bags for Numbered Highways 17, 105, 594, 627.

WHEN: Saturday April 20th (alternate weather day Saturday May 4th)

- WHERE: Open to all roads and Highways within the Municipality of Machin
- HOW: Sign-up/Contact sheet and Garbage bags can be picked up at the Municipal Office from Monday April 15th to Friday the 19th during regular office hours 8 a.m. 4 p.m.; as well on Saturday April 20th from 9 a.m. 12 p.m. at volunteer tables setup at the Vermilion Bay Fire Hall and Eagle River Fire Hall. At the same locations pick-up a Safety Flyer with safety tips to help keep us safe while participating in this volunteer initiative.
- Pick-up garbage bags (supplied by the Municipality) for municipal roads (black bags for garbage & clear bags for recycle material). Large black bags are supplied by Emcon for cleaning numbered highways (please limit # of bags you take based on what you will fill)
- For volunteers who plan to participate but may not need supplies from the pick-up locations, we ask that you contact the Municipal Office ph. 227-2633 or email at <u>deputyclerk@visitmachin.com</u> so we can get a better account of how many are participating.

MORE INFORMATION:

- The Municipality has granted permission to bring these bags to the landfill with no charge. Volunteers can drop their bags off at the Municipal Landfills that are open or leave them on the road edges for pickup by volunteers or the Public Works Department. Emcon will pick-up along the numbered highways (large black bags).
- We encourage volunteers to recycle where possible to help extend the life of our landfills (clear bags). Crush recycle material as much as possible to optimize Blue Box space at the landfills. Clear bags containing recycle material can be deposited directing into the recycle bins at the landfills, any black bags containing recycle material must be emptied into the recycle bins. Where possible separate aluminum pop and beer tins, and beer bottles for a possible refund deposit that can be donated to a local cause (If volunteers feel safe doing so).
- Please make sure your bags are visible along the roads but well off the road to make sure they are not impeding the flow of traffic.
- If your bags are not picked up by Tuesday April 23^{rd,} please contact the Municipal Office to ensure they are removed.
