# **Municipal Notes**

## **COUNCIL NEWS**

Mayor and Council hope that everyone has been enjoying their summer; all the rainfall we've received lately has helped lift the restricted fire zone for our area but we hope everyone continues to be cautious when burning or having a campfire.

July was a busy month for us as we had many meetings for different projects we are working on. On July 11<sup>th</sup> staff from N1 solutions visited Machin to host a strategic planning session for our update to the Economic Strategic Plan which included Mayor, Council, staff, members of the Economic Development Committee, and business stakeholders. Thank you to everyone who was able to attend! The session reviewed the previous Economic Strategic Plan, looked at an overview of our Municipality through the consultant's perspective, reviewed our strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats, and discussed what our future goals are and how we can achieve them after 6 months to 5 years.

Staff from N1 Solutions and Fotenn also joined municipal staff and members of Council for a Community Improvement Plan meeting where potential incentives offered through the plan were discussed. As a reminder, a Community Improvement Plan is a planning tool that allows the Municipality to offer incentives to increase development in defined areas of the Municipality. This is a public process and members of the public will be notified when the drafted plan is ready for public review. We are hoping this will be sometime in October of this year.

Workers from the Ministry of Environment, Conservation, and Parks travelled to the Vermilion Bay Landfill on July 14<sup>th</sup> to review current operations at the landfill, discuss any work that should be done, and talk about what's needed to confirm the landfill capacity. Confirming the landfill capacity has been an issue that the Municipality has been dealing with for many years. The tests/studies needed to confirm the landfill capacity are costly and something we don't feel the taxpayers should subsidize. Until we receive funding from the government to cover the unincorporated areas that use our landfill, we do not plan on completing these studies.

The Kenora District Services Board and Urban Systems has been working on a Regional Housing Strategy over the past two years for the Kenora District. Part of this process included public meetings to gather community feedback and we thank those who were able to attend! The final document can be found on the Kenora District Services Board website <u>www.kdsb.on.ca</u>. If you click "About Us" and then "Reports and Plans" you'll be able to access the document. The document is very useful especially for our Municipality since it included relevant information that can be used for future development attraction or funding opportunities.

### Economic Development:

The Municipality has remained in contact with staff from Associate Minister Cho's (MTO) office that we met at NOMA where we discussed various issues we've faced with the Ministry. After these talks, we've been put in contact with staff from Minister Mulroney's office (MTO). We have a meeting scheduled at the beginning of August where we'll continue to bring light to the redtape/challenges that we've encountered with the Ministry of Transportation. Some of these issues include permits for our digital speed signs, specifically the cost; our main goal/issue is to advocate for Cascade Bridge being a connecting link because of its use, especially on detour routes, when Highway 17 is closed between Machin and Dryden. With repairs needed for the Cascade Bridge in the future it's crucial that we're able to apply for funding to help with these through the Connecting Links Funding program.

## Do you need your water tested for lead?

The most common sources of lead in drinking water have been found in lead pipes, faucets, and plumbing fixtures. Certain pipes that carry drinking water from the water source to the home may contain lead. Household plumbing fixtures, welding solder, and pipe fittings made prior to 1986 may also contain lead. Because no safe blood level has been identified for young children, all sources of lead exposure for children should be controlled or eliminated. If you would like to have your household tested for lead, please contact Shawna Alberts at the Vermilion Bay Water Treatment Plant (227-2064) and you will be added to a list to be sampled in 2023.

# **NO DAY BURING!**

Fires can only be ignited 2 hours before sunset, or later and must be extinguished 2 hours after sunrise, or earlier.

## Important Fire Safety Reminders

### FIRE ESCAPE PLANS - In a fire emergency, everyone must know what to do and where to go

Make sure everyone knows two ways out of each room, if possible.

Choose a meeting place outside, where everyone can be accounted for.

Make sure all doors and windows open easily and are kept clear of obstructions.

Make sure all designated escape routes are always kept accessible and free of clutter.

Determine who will be responsible for helping anyone in the household that may need assistance.

To decrease the risk of smoke inhalation, get low and go under the smoke to the nearest safe exit.

Call 911 from outside the home.

Once out, stay out. Never re-enter a burning building.

ELECTRICAL SAFETY:

Outlets in bathrooms or within one metre of the kitchen sink should be the Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter (GFCI) type. Use of extension cords should be avoided. If extension cords can't be avoided, use multi-outlet power bars that are approved and provide surge protection and a circuit breaker.

Extension cords should not be linked together.

Do not run electrical cords under carpets or rugs where they can be easily damaged and cause a fire.

Regularly check cords for damage such as fraying or nicks. A damaged cord can expose wires and result in a potential shock or fire hazard.

Air conditioners and other heavy appliances should be plugged directly into an outlet.

COOKING SAFETY - Cooking is the #1 cause of home fires

Always stay in the kitchen and stay alert when cooking.

Keep anything that can catch fire a safe distance from the stovetop.

Keep a proper fitting pot lid near the stove when cooking. If a pot catches fire, slide the lid over the pot and turn off the stove. Do not move the pot.

Wear tight-fitting or rolled up sleeves when using the stove. Loose dangling clothing can easily catch fire. If your clothing catches fire, stop, drop to the ground and roll over and over to put out the fire.

### FIRE EXTINGUISHERS:

Inspect the fire extinguisher once a month and have it serviced by a certified technician every year.

Many stovetop fires can be safely extinguished by covering the pot with a lid and turning off the stove and without the use of a fire extinguisher.

Fire extinguishers should be used **only** by people who have been trained to use them.

Fire extinguishers should be used **only** on small, contained fires. Never let the fire get between you and the exit.

Know when to go. If the fire does not go out after using one fire extinguisher, back out of the area, close the door if possible, and safely get outside and call 911.

In most cases, the best thing to do in a home fire is to get everyone out of the home immediately and call 911 from outside.

Regarding renovating your home or perhaps new build, as a Municipality of Machin resident, it is your responsibility to acquire a building/demolition permit **before** you start your building/demolition project. It is also your responsibility to be aware of the Machin Zoning Bylaws.

The following is a list of items to help you determine whether a permit would be required for a renovation project in the Municipality of Machin:

• Constructing accessory buildings with an area of more than 15 square metres (160 square feet), or an addition to an existing building

- Constructing attached or detached garages
- Structural alterations
- Excavating, repairing, or underpinning a foundation
- Heating ventilation, air conditioning, plumbing, or electrical work
- Constructing one or more new separate dwelling units within a building
- Finishing previously unfinished spaces within a building
- Adding new entrances or windows, changing the size of entrances or windows, or closing entrances or windows
- Constructing chimneys or fireplaces

• Installing swimming pool enclosures, constructing detached decks more than 60.96 centimetres (24 inches) above ground, or building any deck attached to a building.

Demolishing or relocating all or part of a building. You are not required to obtain a permit for these renovations:


- Replacing stucco, siding, or shingles with the same material
- Replacing doors or windows without altering the opening,
- Constructing fences (except pool enclosure fences)
- Patching, painting, and decorating

### Installing cabinets or shelves

Prefabricated accessory buildings are becoming more and more popular, and they do require a permit when over 15 square meters in size. These types of buildings have usage limitations in the Ontario Building Code and in the Machin Zoning Bylaw.
