Municipal Notes

COUNCIL NEWS

Mayor and Council would like to give our condolences to all of Gord Dingman's family and friends. Gord was Mayor for the Municipality of Machin from 2010-2014 and a Vermilion Bay Lions Club member for numerous years. We appreciate the years he spent bettering our community and are grateful that Gord was a member of our community.

Congratulations to Soulless Tattoo & Vape for putting on another fantastic Sunset on the Strip at the Vermilion Bay Airport! This year they added an extra night of fun with having a band play Friday night as well as new food trucks and entertainment throughout the weekend. Thank you to Big City All Star Band, Grant Leutschaft, Open Faith, Tim Albertson, Harlequin and The Reklaws for their performances. We'd also like to thank our Machin Volunteer Fire Department for their help before and during the event, we appreciate all that you do for our area. We can't forget about all the volunteers who helped out at the event, thank you to all for helping out Sunset on the Strip and making it another great year. Can't wait for next years event!

After reviewing proposals and ongoing discussions, the Municipality is considering switching our banking services to TD. Out of all proposals, they were the most competitive offering the best value for our money in the bank and cash management service needs. Residents can still be set-up for pre-authorized debit payments from their bank account for taxes or water bills and can still use our online e-payment option on our website to pay tax or water bills through credit cards. We are still weighing the options of adding point-of-sale debit/credit machines in the Municipality. There should be a decision on this option by the end of August. If you have a question on how this could impact you for paying your taxes or water bills, please contact municipal office staff at 807-227-2633. We are excited for this new opportunity of banking as we move closer to modernizing our services.

Reminder to everyone that volunteer recognition nomination forms are due at the end of August so please submit them before August 31st. Forms can be picked up at our municipal office or can be printed off our website under the "forms" section. Categories for nomination include Youth, Senior, Beautification, Recreation, and Community Development. We have so many great volunteers in our community. Please take the time to fill out these forms so we can properly acknowledge all the great help and work they've done for our community!

A big thank you goes out to Geoff Hartley and the hard work he's been doing for the Municipality as our licensed trapper. This has been a year where nuisance beavers are overly populated, Geoff has been doing a great job of keeping them from damaging municipal infrastructure and preventing unwanted damage. Thank you, Geoff!

Economic Development:

Unfortunately, the start of our stage 1 archaeological assessment has been delayed. The new planned start date is now the beginning-mid August. Once completed and pending the results, we will sit down with MNRF and talk about moving forward with a Public Consultation for the Ely Lake Development Project. Our Vermilion Bay North Cemetery Expansion project is still pending the official confirmation from the Surveyor Generals office. This has been the case since February this year and MNRF has no updates. This project is a great example of the frustrations that come with trying to acquire Crown Land, a simple project started over 3 years ago yet is still not completed and has no timeline of when we can expect to see it completed.

Council approved the Blue Lake Road subdivision with the agreed upon conditions that Machin plans on completing within the next year. However, if there are delays, we have up until 5 years to fulfill each condition. These conditions include: final plan be submitted to Machin by an Ontario Licensed Surveyor and submitted to the Land Registry Office, final plan must illustrate 10 lots, the subject property be rezoned from rural to rural residential, a minimum of one test well be drilled confirming there is adequate quantity and quality for residential use, the access road be upgraded to municipal standards, a servicing plan be provided for hydro by Hydro One, and for approval for sewage treatment provided by the Northwestern Health Unit. All of this work is already under way, and by the next Messenger the final survey should be completed, well drilling (already completed), and the inspection from the Northwestern Health Unit. We are working on a plan to begin the road work and issue a request for proposal for some assistance on what we have to do; we're also working with Hydro One to begin the work needed to have the hydro servicing plan done for the development.

We've began using our new GIS system and are very happy with the results! Staff has been spending time getting trained on how to use the new system as well as making note of areas that will need to be updated. Some of these areas include zoning changes to property since the early 2000s and any land planning applications that have resulted in land severances. The goal would be to have the system up to date within a few months, after which we can start adding culvert coordinates and incorporate asset man-

agement into this new system. This may not seem like a lot but for a small municipality like ourselves this will make a big difference with keeping accurate information and working more efficiently.

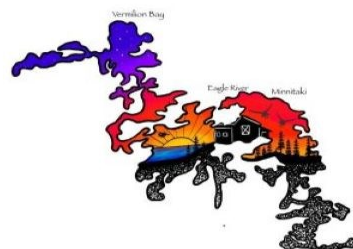

Machin Fire and First Response Volunteers wish to remind motorists about the Ontario “Move Over Law.”

When approaching a stopped emergency vehicle with flashing lights drivers must:

Slow down: Reduce your speed and slow down to less than the posted speed limit.

Pass with caution: Proceed with caution and pass.

Move over: If it is safe to do so, provide a lane of space between your vehicle and the emergency vehicle.

Every second counts when emergency vehicles are rushing to respond to calls for help – any delay can be critical. Ontario law requires motorists to pull to the right and stop the moment it is safe to do so.

When an emergency vehicle approaches from any direction with sirens or flashing lights drivers should: **Slow down. Signal.**

Move to the right side of the road, clear of any intersection, once safe to do so.

Stop.

Once the emergency vehicle has passed, check to make sure the way is clear and signal before merging back into traffic.

Emergency vehicles include: police cars, firetrucks, ambulances, tow trucks and public utility vehicles.

If you see a flashing green light, please yield or pull over. Volunteer firefighters and first responders use the green flashing light in their own private vehicles to alert motorists that they are responding to an emergency.

Contact Machin Volunteer Fire and First Response if need a smoke/CO alarm, fire safety information, or if interested in volunteering with the department. Volunteer applications can also be picked up at the Municipal Office. No experience required.

RECYCLING

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS WILL BE ACCEPTED AT MACHIN LANDFILLS:

- containers with a recycling triangle on the bottom containing the numbers 1,2,3,4,5,6 or 7 (new)
- household paper, shredded paper, and envelopes
- steel (tin) food cans
- flattened cardboard - no more than one meter, (39 inches) in any direction**
- aluminum beverage cans
- cardboard egg cartons and paper tubes
- polycoated (milk cartons, juice cartons, etc.)
- flattened cardboard – (cereal box, cracker box, shoe & tissue boxes, laundry, packing boxes etc.)
- tetrapacks (juice boxes, etc.)
- magazines, phone books, books (with the hard cover removed)
- newspapers and inserts, flyers, junk mail

- *Crush plastic bottles, milk and juice cartons and aluminum cans to leave more room in your Blue Box*
- *Remove plastic screw caps from containers.*
- *Rinse out your containers!*
- ***REMEMBER, NO plastic bags please!***

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS NOT ACCEPTABLE AT MACHIN LANDFILLS:

- glass
- aluminum foil or foil pie plates, metal hangers
- aerosol cans, propane bottles**
- anything containing a hazardous substance (motor oil, paint thinner, paint, etc.)
- foil or foam takeout food containers
- plastic bags, plastic packaging, and cellophane
- plastic (screw caps, toys, flowerpots)
- foam packaging, foam egg cartons or foam meat trays

Please no scrap metal in recycling bins!

Please note that waste disposable cards and permit applications are available at both landfill sites.

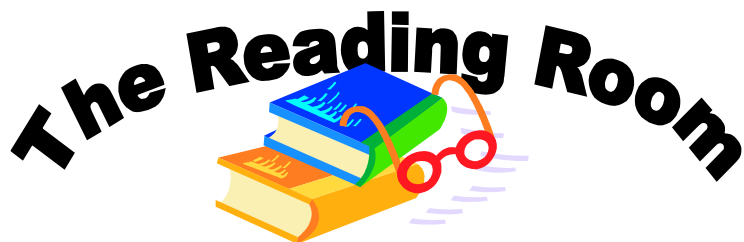
