Municipal Notes

COUNCIL NEWS

The Municipality is pleased to announce that we have decided to move forward with Steenhof Mining Services' proposal to provide engineering and government support services for the design, costing, and business case development of a new and much-needed Medical Clinic and EMS base in our community. We look forward to working closely with Henry Wall, Steven Tremblay, and other members of the Steenhof team as we take the next steps toward making this vital project a reality. Their work will build on the previous cost projection and feasibility study, allowing us to refine a cost-effective and practical design that meets the needs of our residents. In addition to the technical planning, Steenhof will also assist in preparing a strong case to present to government partners as we seek support and funding. We are excited to see this project progress and remain committed to improving access to essential healthcare and emergency services for our community.

The Municipality, along with Dr. Gagnon and Jennifer Loewen from the Points North Family Health Team, were pleased to virtually meet with representatives from NOSM University to discuss our proposed new Medical Clinic and explore potential funding opportunities to support the project. The Province of Ontario has announced a \$300 million investment aimed at expanding learning opportunities in medical clinics across the province, and NOSM University will be receiving a portion of this funding to help carry out the government's goal of strengthening healthcare access and medical education in northern and rural communities. We sincerely thank the NOSM team for organizing this valuable discussion and extend our gratitude to Dr. Owen Prowse, Dr. Kristy Cote, and Dr. Edward Hirvi for taking the time to meet with us, share insights, and learn more about our community's vision. Their perspective on NOSM's role in supporting clinical learning and development opportunities in new medical facilities was appreciated and encouraging. We look forward to keeping an open and ongoing line of communication with Dr. Prowse, Dr. Cote, and Dr. Hirvi as we continue to advance our clinic project and explore opportunities for funding and partnership together.

Mayor Griffiths recently had the opportunity to speak with Ontario's Minister of Finance, Peter Bethlenfalvy, to discuss several ongoing issues impacting the Municipality. We would like to sincerely thank Minister Bethlenfalvy for taking the time to chat and for his willingness to listen to the unique challenges our commu-

nity faces. The conversation was extremely productive and allowed for open dialogue on the financial pressures many small and rural municipalities are currently navigating. Mayor Griffiths emphasized the importance of sustainable funding models that reflect the realities of delivering essential services in northern and rural areas. We appreciate Minister Bethlenfalvy's openness to exploring potential solutions. The Municipality looks forward to working collaboratively with the Minister and his team to identify meaningful ways that small municipalities like ours can be better supported to ensure long-term financial stability and continued growth.

The Municipality would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to Mayor Fred Mota and the Municipality of Red Lake for the kind invitation to join in celebrating their Centennial Anniversary of the discovery of gold in Red Lake. It was a pleasure to be part of such a significant milestone for the community, and we commend everyone involved in making the event such a success. A special thank you goes out to all the sponsors and volunteers whose hard work and dedication brought the celebration to life. We would also like to express our sincere appreciation to the Ministers who made the effort to travel to Red Lake and took the time to speak with Mayor Griffiths during their visit. Having Ministers present in our region is incredibly important, as it provides them with a first-hand understanding of the unique challenges and opportunities we face in the north. We are grateful for the opportunity to share our experiences and continue meaningful conversations that will impact our small communities moving forward.

Economic Development:

The Municipality is disappointed to share that our recent application to the Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF) Capital Grant for the replacement of the ice plant at the Woodland Arena was unfortunately not approved. This funding was a crucial piece in making the project financially feasible, and we are deeply disappointed by the outcome. That said, we remain committed to exploring every possible avenue to move this much-needed project forward. We still have a grant application under review with the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation (NOHFC), which, if approved, would support a significant portion of the cost. However, without the OTF funding, the Municipality would now be responsible for approximately \$170,000 of the total cost—more than double the \$66,000 we would have contributed had both grants been approved. We are also actively looking into available incentive programs related to energy efficiency and equipment upgrades to determine whether they apply to this project. If eligible, such incentives could help bridge the financial gap and be the deciding factor in whether we are able to proceed with the replacement of the ice plant at this time. We recognize

the importance of this facility to our community and will continue working to find solutions that ensure its long-term viability.

Your time, effort, and commitment to improving healthcare in our community do not go unnoticed, and we are truly grateful to have your partnerships in this project.

It was so nice to be back in the community at the end of June and beginning of July—I truly missed the area and all of you. It was great to reconnect and spend time in the office. I'd like to extend a thank you to the local businesses that kindly allowed me to film for the Economic Development Committee, and a big thank you to the Vermilion Bay Lions Club for letting me capture footage during their successful fish fry event. I'm currently working on putting together the video content and hope to begin releasing some of the finished pieces in the next month or two. There's still a bit of additional footage needed before the videos are complete, thank you to those that have agreed to help in capturing the final footage. I'm looking forward to sharing the results with all of you—and even more so, I'm looking forward to my next visit back to the community.

Public Works:

A big thank you to our Public Works crew for spray washing the Medical Clinic and Eagle River Recreation Centre. The difference is truly impeccable—both buildings look fantastic! Your hard work and attention to detail are greatly appreciated.

Our crew is preparing to have various sections of our road network sprayed with calcium as part of our ongoing efforts to manage and maintain our road infrastructure this summer season. Thanks to our crew for their great efforts this year and maintaining our parks, buildings, and important infrastructure.

POWER OUTAGES

To be prepared in case of a power outage:

- Create a family emergency plan. Identify the safest enclosed space in your home along with a safe meeting place outside of the home, in case it is necessary to evacuate the house. Be sure that everyone knows what to do and where to go in case of an emergency.
- Have a 72-hour emergency supply kit which includes things such as a list of emergency numbers and important contacts, canned and dried foods, manual can openers, water (2 litres per person per day), batteries, flashlights, a first aid kit, blankets, cash, a cell phone battery charger, prescriptions and any other necessary medical supplies. Make sure everyone knows where the kit is kept.
- Plug your electronics into a surge protector. This reduces the risk of electrical hazards such as fires, dangerous surges and damaged items such as laptops or TVs.

Before a storm or possible power outage:

- Ensure that 72-hour emergency kit is stocked and contact numbers are up to date.
- Keep all mobile phones fully charged so that you'll be able to get the latest information, update others, and check on loved ones.
- Lower your fridge to 40°F/4°C and your freezer to 0°F/-18°C to maintain a colder temperature as long as possible to protect your food supply.

During a power outage:

- Call 1-800-434-1235 to report the power outage and/or any downed power lines to Hydro One.
- Stay at least 10 metres (30 feet) back from a downed power line.
- Do not use fuel-burning heaters, lights, generators or portable stoves designed for outdoor use inside the house. Since they are designed for outside use, they have no exhaust system to evacuate the carbon monoxide fumes and can cause asphyxiation or poisoning when used inside.
- Do not touch electrical equipment that may have been exposed to water.
- If a power line falls on vehicle while you are inside it, stay in your vehicle and call 9-1-1, **unless** vehicle is on fire. If your vehicle is on fire, then leave vehicle immediately by doing the "bunny hop" – jump out with your feet together so that you don't touch the ground and vehicle at the same time.
- Check in on neighbours and friends in your area.

After the power is restored:

- Check your electrical panel and electrical installation for damage. If you see sparks or broken or frayed wires, notice a smell or feel heat, turn off the power at the electrical panel, if it is safe to do so. Do not walk through water to get to the electrical panel. Contact an electrician if there is any damage to electrical installation.
- Turn on appliances and electronics one at a time to avoid a power surge.
- Dispose of any spoiled food in your fridge and freezer.
- Restock your 72-hour emergency supply kit as needed.

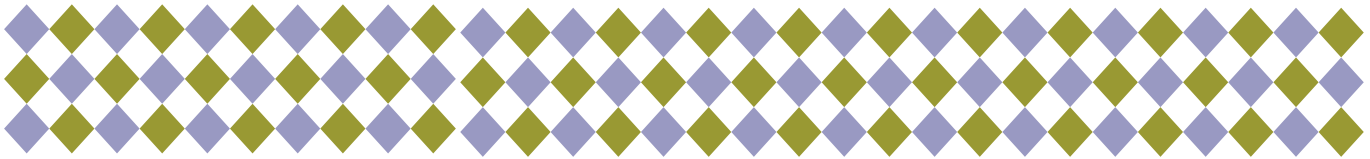

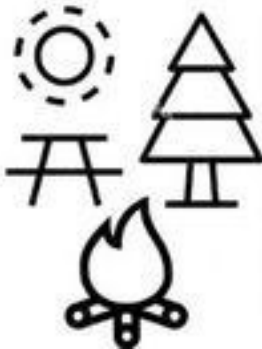
