# **COUNCIL NEWS**

Winter is finally here; we hope everyone can make time to enjoy the many outdoor recreational activities our area offers during the winter months! Mayor and Council would like to thank everyone who attended the Special Council Meeting for the swearing in of New Council on November 21<sup>st</sup>. Committee representatives that were appointed at the Council Meeting are posted below; we are all excited to get to work and serve the community!

We'd like to acknowledge the rising cases of COVID and illnesses in our region. The holiday season is a time to spend with family and friends; we hope that everyone is still able to enjoy their holiday activities in a safe manner.

After a year of advocating for the transfer of the old Highway 647 that runs through our airport property it seems that MTO has made their decision. Originally the Ministry wanted the Municipality to pay market value for the sale of the road allowance; however, after conversations with Ministry employees and letters written to Minister Mulroney, MTO has decided the land should be transferred over for no fee. This is a big step forward towards future development at our airport!

There has been a lot of discussions lately regarding our new arena rates; specifically, season passes. Our new season pass prices are based off our daily rates opposed to previous years where there was a fixed fee for a family pass. We are also offering two free public skating and/or pick-up hockey specials where after 10 paid visits your next two visits are free. Arena staff will keep track of your visits to public skating and/or pick-up hockey to track when you receive your two free visits.

The Municipality is moving forward with our plans to have a Feasibility Study/Cost Projection done for an Ambulance Base & Health Clinic. The proposed location of this potential build is the CP Property which was purchased this year. Having a Feasibility Study/Cost Projection strengthens our chance of being successful with future funding programs which is critical to the success of this project.

We are applying for the Resilient Communities Fund through the Ontario Trillium Foundation for the costs associated with extending the Recreational Facilitator contract two more years. #### 'Tis the Season to Be Fire Safe!

# Prevent these leading causes of fire during the Holidays:

Cooking – Always stay in the kitchen while cooking. If you must leave turn off the stove.

Heating Equipment – Heating systems and chimneys should be inspected and cleaned annually by a qualified service technician.

Smoking – Butt-out cigarettes in large, deep ashtrays. Ashes should be emptied in a metal container, not the garbage can, and put outside.

Alcohol – Drink responsibly. Attempting to cook or smoke while under the influence is too often a contributing factor in house fires.

# Fire safety for Holiday decorations:

Lights – Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use. Use the appropriate lights.

Make sure lights have the logo of a recognized safety standards agency such as CSA or ULC

Read the manufacturer's instructions for the number and types of light strands that can be strung together safely.

Replace any string of lights that have worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections.

Always turn off indoor decorative lights before leaving home or going to bed.

Trees – If choosing a real tree, pick one that has been freshly cut; needles should not fall off when touched.

Make a fresh cut 5cms (2") off the base of the trunk before placing the tree in the stand.

Keep the tree stand full of water.

Make sure the tree is at least 1 metre (3 feet) away from any heat source.

Never place lit candles on the tree.

Discard the tree when it dries out and large amounts of needles begin to fall off.

Candles – Keep candles in a sturdy holder away from children, pets and anything that can burn. Blow candles out before leaving the room.

# Remember fire moves faster than you:

Install smoke and carbon monoxide alarms in your home and test them every month.

Have a home escape plan with a meeting place outside.

Make sure everyone in household knows the home escape plan and what to do if they hear the smoke or CO alarm.




