

Municipal Notes

COUNCIL NEWS

Just like that we're all getting ready for the holiday season! It's been an eventful year for the Municipality as our current Council officially finishes the first year of a four-year term. In 2023 we've completed a new Economic Strategic Plan, Community Improvement Plan, welcomed and hosted a concert at the Vermilion Bay Airport, completed a cost projection/feasibility study for a new joint Health Clinic/EMS Base, installed new playground equipment at the Pine Tree Park, welcomed Junior A hockey to our Woodland Arena, advanced the subdivision development at our Blue Lake Road property, and advanced our Ely Lake Development. We can't forget all the wonderful recreation programs that are happening in our area and special events that provide social, physical, and mental benefits for our community. We've enjoyed being a part of municipal projects and seeing all that is happening in Machin this past year.

Thank you to everyone who came out to support the Kenora Devils Gap Islanders hockey team during the month of November and to our volunteers who help make each night a success. We owe a big thank you to our arena manager Tasha Doudiet and Councillor Tony Blair for their hard work on getting ice in this season. It's been a busy start to the arena season and we are grateful for all the work that has been done. We hope to continue to see increased attendance at each game!

Council would like to thank Randy and Kevin McGogy from Copperite Plumbing & Heating for their work at the Eagle River rink. Randy and Kevin installed a new jet pump at the Eagle River rink and fixed the existing water line that was experiencing intake problems in the river. We appreciate you coming out on such short notice to help us with these issues. We also owe a big thank you to Jim Welz from Jim's Electrical Service for donating his time and supplies to work on electrical issues with the pump at the Eagle River rink,. Thank you Jim!

Mayor Griffiths and our EDO visited the MNRF office in Dryden on November 9th to talk about the Ely Lake development project. We met with MNRF staff to discuss our frustrations with the recent information that MNRF was asking for. More specifically, we were frustrated with the timing of the request of information since it pertained to a document we submitted last year. We have followed up and provided the Ministry with the information they have requested and will now move forward with their environmental screening process. The Municipality received word that we are acquiring funding for accessibility upgrades at our municipal office. Some of you may recall that in October of 2022 we applied for the Enabling Accessibility Grant through the Federal Government to cover the costs of installing accessible doors at our office and a chair lift system. Unfortunately, we were declined in April of this year; however, we were just informed that there is funding left and that our project has now been approved. The Machin office will now begin the request for proposal process and look to start the accessibility work on our office next year.

Economic Development:

We are applying to the provincial government though the Emergency Preparedness Grant for costs to purchase a genesis telescopic ram and genesis e-pack power bank which will both be used by our fire department in emergency situations. Both pieces of equipment will aid the fire department when responding to vehicle collisions and help save future lives. This particular grant is looking to fund projects that increase community's emergency preparedness, in the Machin Emergency Plan the number 2 most likely hazard is highway transportation accidents.

Due to a busy spring/summer season and the development of our new economic strategic plan the Economic Development Committee met on November 6th for the first time since May. The committee discussed previous information including developing a local map/brochure for businesses in Machin as well as talked about implementing the new strategic plan. The committee went over the strategic action items in the plan, assigning duties for each item, and deciding that every meeting there will be an update on the progress of implementing the plan. Meeting minutes are available on our website if you'd like to stay up to date. As a follow up to the November Messenger, we are still waiting to complete the draft plan of subdivision for the Blue Lake Road Property. In December our municipal planner intends to visit the property site and work with municipal staff on completing the actual subdivision document for Mayor and Council to review. Machin Council have approved the following hours of operation over the 2023 Christmas/New Year period as follows:

The Highway Traffic Act R.S.O. 1990, C. H.8, S. 181 states: "No person shall deposit snow or ice on a roadway without permission in writing to do so from the Ministry or road authority responsible for maintenance of the road". The penalty on conviction is a fine of \$105.00.





Christmas lights and decorations fire safety:

Choose the right lights and decorations for the job. Lights and other decorations are rated for indoor or outdoor use and should be CSA approved. Use GFCI outlets when plugging in outdoors. Read the package instructions, and never exceed the recommended wattage or the recommended number of light strings that can be strung together.

Check all decorations and lights before using, especially outdoor decorations as weather can deteriorate them over time. Do not use any electrical products that are damaged or have frayed or worn cords.

Staples and nails can damage electrical cords. Use the proper clips for securing lights and decorations.

Check for overhead power lines before using a ladder to put up decorations outside.

Do not overload electrical circuits – this can create overheating and result in a fire. Fuses that frequently blow and circuits that trip can indicate too man y items are connected to the circuit.

Keep outdoor connections off of the ground and don't run cords across driveways or walkways.

Live Christmas Tree Safety:

If using a real tree – make a fresh cut across the trunk about 2cms (1") from the original cut when you bring the tree into the house. Keep the stand full of plenty of water at all times. Trees can drink up to four litres of water per day. Place the tree away from fireplaces, radiators, electronics and other sources of heat. When large amounts of needles begin to fall off, it's time to get rid of the tree.

Fireplace Safety:

Never leave a fireplace unattended and always use a fireplace screen.

Use only seasoned and dried wood in the fireplace. Don't burn wrapping paper or ribbons or boxes or other types of packing in a fireplace. Never use flammable liquids to start a fire.

Don't hang Christmas stockings or other flammable materials on mantle when fireplace is being used.

Clean the ashes regularly, place them in a metal container and store it outside away from structures or other flammable materials.

Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Alarms:

Install smoke alarms on every storey of your home and outside all sleeping areas. CO alarms are required outside all bedrooms. Test your smoke and CO alarms every month and install new batteries if needed.

Smoke alarms can be the difference between living or dying in a fire – Fire spreads so quickly that you may have less than 3 minutes to escape a fire in your home. That means you need as much time as possible to safely escape.

And just as important as smoke alarms, you have to make sure everyone in your home knows what to do when the smoke alarms sound in an emergency: Practice a home escape plan with everyone in the home, have two ways out of every room, if possible, make sure someone is responsible for helping young children, older adults or people with disabilities to leave the home, and choose a meeting place outside where everyone can be accounted for.

Regarding renovating your home or perhaps new build, as a Municipality of Machin resident, it is your responsibility to acquire a building/demolition permit **before** you start your building/demolition project. It is also your responsibility to be aware of the Machin Zoning Bylaws.

The following is a list of items to help you determine whether a permit would be required for a renovation project in the Municipality of Machin:

• Constructing accessory buildings with an area of more than 15 square metres (160 square feet), or an addition to an existing building

- Constructing attached or detached garages
- Structural alterations
- Excavating, repairing, or underpinning a foundation
- Heating ventilation, air conditioning, plumbing, or electrical work
- Constructing one or more new separate dwelling units within a building
- Finishing previously unfinished spaces within a building
- Adding new entrances or windows, changing the size of entrances or windows, or closing entrances or windows
- Constructing chimneys or fireplaces

• Installing swimming pool enclosures, constructing detached decks more than 60.96 centimetres (24 inches) above ground, or building any deck attached to a building.

Demolishing or relocating all or part of a building. You are not required to obtain a permit for these renovations:

- Replacing stucco, siding, or shingles with the same material
- Replacing doors or windows without altering the opening,
- Constructing fences (except pool enclosure fences)
- Patching, painting, and decorating

Installing cabinets or shelves

Prefabricated accessory buildings are becoming more and more popular, and they do require a permit when over 15 square meters in size. These types of buildings have usage limitations in the Ontario Building Code and in the Machin Zoning Bylaw. 
Christmas in the Village 2023




