Municipal Notes

COUNCIL NEWS

Mayor and Council hope that everyone enjoyed their holidays and wish everyone a Happy New Year! We are eager to begin the New Year and have some exciting news to start. In December we found out that our grant to the Ontario Trillium Foundation was successful; at the beginning of August, we applied for playground equipment and fitness equipment to be installed at the Pine Tree Park. The program will cover 98% of the costs for this project!

In December we reached an agreement to lease the Credit Union until the end of July 2023; at the end of this lease the goal is to have the building sold to the lessee. The money generated from the lease and future sale of the building, will be used towards progressing our current projects.

We'd like to take the time to update the public on the status of current projects the Municipality has been working on. Mayor and Council were presented with a draft report for a Phase 1 Environmental Site Assessment for the former CP Property. Unfortunately the report recommended that further investigating take place on the property since the investigation found that two potentially contaminating activities took place formerly on the property. While we are not worried there is contamination present, government red-tape/regulations require investigating to be done. In other news, MNRF has told us that they are transferring their portion of road allowances at our airport. This stemmed from ongoing talks with the Municipality and MTO; once we legally own the road allowances, we can move forward with our development plans at the airport.

Mayor and Council would like to thank Norbert Bruyere and Rose Rhyner for taking down the summer flags and installing the winter flags on the flag poles In Vermilion Bay. We'd also like to thank the volunteers who helped decorate the Eagle River Historical Park before Christmas. Your volunteer help is much appreciated!

Economic Development:

What a great way to start the New Year by finding out we've

been approved for new playground equipment and fitness equipment at the Pine Tree Park! The idea developed last year from discussions between the Revitalization Committee members; after first being declined for the project we were extremely happy to see it get approved the second time we applied!

Letters from Mayor Griffiths to the Minister of Transportation, Caroline Mulroney, have helped us move forward on the issue regarding the Ely Lake Road access issue. Up until mid-December, MTO required the Municipality to own the Langton Township Road for the potential cottage lot development. However, after many letters and a signed agreement between Machin and the Dryden Forest Management Company; MTO has came back saying we now meet the requirements to move forward with the potential development. Our next step is completing a Lakeshore Capacity Assessment for MNRF to determine the amount of lots that the lake can support. We will continue to move forward on this project as we outweigh costs vs benefits doing so.

Do you need your water tested for lead?

The most common sources of lead in drinking water have been found in lead pipes, faucets, and plumbing fixtures. Certain pipes that carry drinking water from the water source to the home may contain lead. Household plumbing fixtures, welding solder, and pipe fittings made prior to 1986 may also contain lead. Because no safe blood level has been identified for young children, all sources of lead exposure for children should be controlled or eliminated. If you would like to have your household tested for lead, please contact Shawna Alberts at the Vermilion Bay Water Treatment Plant (227-2064) and you will be added to a list to be sampled in 2023.

Participated in the goodbye parade for Dryden Fire; helped in the community with the Spring Road Clean-up, Bike Rodeo at Lillian Berg School, Machin Family Day, Walk for Wenjack, and the Machin Holiday parade; and did safety presentations at Machin's Day Camp, and for Fire Prevention Week at Lillian Berg School.

Congratulations to Darcy Spalding on receiving the Firefighter of The Year Award sponsored by The Standard Insurance. Thank you, Darcy, for all of your help responding to calls and at the fire halls!




