Municipal Notes

COUNCIL NEWS

Congratulations to all the graduates at Lillian Berg School! We wish all graduates the best of luck as they move on to High School next year and start the next chapter of their lives. Thank you to all Lillian Berg School staff for the hard work they do. Enjoy a safe and happy summer!

Municipal staff received three submissions for our request for proposal for new banking services that we sent out in March of this year. Council and staff will review submissions compared to our current banking services to determine whether a switch is needed and what would be beneficial to the Municipality. Some areas we are looking at are moving to a more digital system including adding debit/credit-card machines at the office and beginning to start using online payment options compared to writing cheques. A cost-factor as well as efficiency factor will be weighed in to our decision to finalize what our best option moving forward is.

The Ministry of Environment Conservation and Parks visited our Eagle River Landfill for a site inspection in the final week of May. During this inspection we took the time to continue our discussions about the overhead costs that are borne by municipal taxpayers and unless the government is providing funding for Machin to complete the tests/studies at both landfills to comply with MECP legislation then we are not going to move forward with compliance. We have still been in touch with the Minister of Environment Conservation and Park's office on this topic, we will continue to discuss this moving forward and try and find a solution that works for both the Municipality and the Ministry.

In June Mayor Griffiths, Councillor Dennis Peterson, our EDO, and our Clerk Treasurer, visited Ear Falls to meet with their staff and Council member. At this meeting different municipal projects and topics were discussed including landfill issues, crown land disposition, health care in each Municipality, and other relevant information related to municipal administration. So far this year we have visited Sioux Narrows Nestor Falls, Rainy River (multiple municipi-

palities), and Ear Falls where we have noticed similarities and differences between each of our communities. Housing is a major issue wherever you go, including market rentals and seniors' apartments. Attracting private developers to the smaller municipalities in the Northwest is an ongoing issue, leaving us to try and develop new housing on our own or by working with the Kenora District Services Board (KDSB).

The Kenora District Municipal Association had their executive meeting in the Machin council chambers in June with some members joining through zoom and some attending in-person. Mayor Griffiths is the KDMA rep for Machin and is joined by other mayors and councillors from 8 other municipalities (Pickle Lake, Sioux Lookout, Ignace, Kenora, Dryden, Red Lake, Ear Falls, Sioux Narrows Nestor Falls). Machin council passed a resolution in June to support KDMA as they lobby the government to include TWOMO (Territories Without Municipal Organization, also referred to as unincorporated or unorganized communities) funding in the District Home for the Aged. Currently, only municipalities are contributing funding to District Home for the Aged, yet this service is available for all residents located in the unorganized communities. KDMA does not believe this is fair as municipal taxpayers are taking on the costs for District Home for the Aged and those who do not contribute to this are also provided the same service. Services supported by municipal taxpayers that are open to, and sometimes no extra charge to the unorganized residents, is a common issue throughout the Northwest and something that we have been dealing with for a long time. We hope the provincial government will recognize this issue, specifically about the District Home for the Aged, and include funding from TWOMO so that their fair share is paid while also lightening the burden on municipal taxpayers.

Economic Development:

The Municipality applied to the Ontario Trillium Foundations Seed Grant for the funds to purchase two interactive projectors to be used by our Recreation Facilitator to run game hours for older adults in our area. Interactive projectors will have over 150 games that display on a table, wall, or floor and aim to improve cognitive abilities while also increasing physical activity. Games include multiplayer formats to get groups of older adults involved. Our

goal is to create a fun atmosphere that is free for all older adults to attend and take part in the many games that are offered through these projectors.

The Municipality accepted a proposal from Woodland Heritage Northwest to complete a stage 1 archaeological assessment for the Ely Lake project. Our expectation is that a stage 2 assessment will not be required; if it is, the timeline will be expanded, and it would be an extra cost to the Municipality. After the assessment is completed, the public consultation process will be started by the Municipality and the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry. In a perfect world, we would see the Crown Land disposed to the Municipality in a year or two; however, we would still need to go through the land severance process before we would be able to have the lots ready for sale. A realistic timeline for this project to be fully completed would be the 3–5-year range, anything under that would be a success.

After some delays with the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation and coding issues with data transfers, our new GIS system should be live this month. Staff will have some time getting trained by our new GIS providers and getting used to the new system. Once comfortable, we will be going through map layers and ensuring boundaries and surveyed property is accurate and then eventually updating our assets into the GIS system like culverts and potentially bridges. This new system will make work a lot easier when it comes to identifying current property owners, property boundaries, zoning, and other useful tools like printing envelopes within a specific geographic area of the Municipality. As mentioned in previous Messengers, this is step forward to modernizing the services at our Municipality as well as improving the accuracy of information the Municipality is able to give property owners moving forward in a timely manner.

Outdoor and Indoor Cooking Safety

BBQ Safety

Before using BBQ

CLEAN: use a pipe cleaner or wire to make sure the burner ports are free of rust, dust, dirt, spider webs or other debris.

CHECK: examine the hose leading from the tank to the burners. Replace if cracked or damaged.

TEST: find leaks by applying a 50/50 solution of water and dish soap to propane cylinder connections and hoses. If bubbles appear, tighten the connection(s) and/or replace the damaged part(s) and retest.

DO NOT place the BBQ close to wooden fences or walls, vinyl siding, or anything that can burn. The area behind your BBQ must be free of anything that can ignite – this is where hot gases escape.

USE BBQS OUTDOORS ONLY. They produce carbon monoxide, a poisonous gas that can lead to unconsciousness and even death. Never use or store propane cylinders inside any structure, including garages.

While using BBQ

- Never leave the BBQ unattended when in use.
- Always use long handled grilling utensils and heat resistant oven mitts to avoid exposure burns from heat and flames.
- Keep loose clothing away from a hot BBQ. Keep children and pets at least one metre (three feet) away from a hot BBQ. When finished barbecuing, turn the gas valve off first, then turn off the burner controls so no gas is left in the connecting hose. Allow the BBQ to cool completely before closing the cover.
- Periodically remove the grease build-up in the catch trays and make sure that grease does not build up on the burners or at the base of the BBQ. Failure to do so could cause a grease fire. Never throw water on a grease fire – this will only spread the flame.

Stove Safety

To prevent cooking fires, you must be alert. You will not be alert if you are sleepy, have consumed alcohol, drugs or medicine that makes you drowsy.

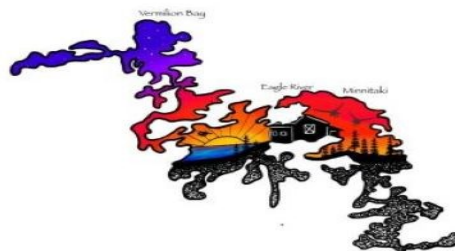
- Always stay in the kitchen while cooking. If you must leave, turn off the stove.
- Keep anything that burns—oven mitts, cooking utensils, dish cloths, paper towels and potholders— a safe distance from the stove.
- Keep a proper-fitting pot lid near the stove when cooking. If a pot catches fire slides the lid over the pot and turn off the stove. Do not move the pot until it has cooled completely.
- Loose-fitting clothes can come into contact with stove burners and catch fire. Wear short sleeves, tight sleeves or roll them up when cooking.

For your safety, working smoke alarms must be installed on every storey of your home and outside all sleeping areas and install carbon monoxide alarms outside all sleeping areas if home has a fuel-burning appliance, a fireplace or an attached garage. Check the alarms expiry date and replace them when they expired. Test alarms monthly to ensure that they are working.

RECYCLING

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS WILL BE ACCEPTED AT MACHIN LANDFILLS

- containers with a recycling triangle on the bottom containing the numbers 1,2,3,4,5,6 or 7 (new)
- household paper, shredded paper, and envelopes
- steel (tin) food cans
- flattened cardboard - no more than one meter, (39 inches) in any direction**
- aluminum beverage cans
- cardboard egg cartons and paper tubes
- polycoated (milk cartons, juice cartons, etc.)
- flattened cardboard – (cereal box, cracker box, shoe & tissue boxes, laundry, packing boxes etc.)
- tetrapacks (juice boxes, etc.)
- magazines, phone books, books (with the hard cover removed)
- newspapers and inserts, flyers, junk mail
- *Crush plastic bottles, milk and juice cartons and aluminum cans to leave more room in your Blue Box*
- *Remove plastic screw caps from containers.*
- *Rinse out your containers!*
- ***REMEMBER, NO plastic bags please!***

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS NOT ACCEPTABLE AT MACHIN LANDFILLS:

- glass
- aluminum foil or foil pie plates, metal hangers
- aerosol cans, propane bottles**
- anything containing a hazardous substance (motor oil, paint thinner, paint, etc.)
- foil or foam takeout food containers
- plastic bags, plastic packaging, and cellophane
- plastic (screw caps, toys, flowerpots)
- foam packaging, foam egg cartons or foam meat trays

Please no scrap metal in recycling bins!

Please note that waste disposal cards and permit applications are available at both landfill sites.

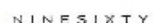

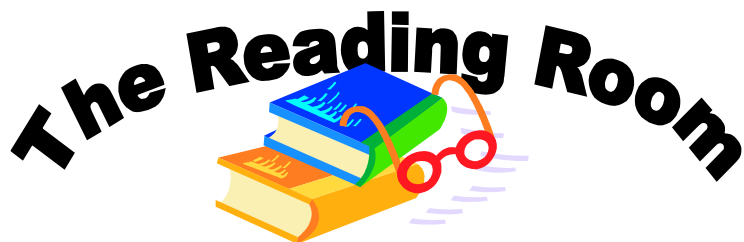
