Municipal Notes

COUNCIL NEWS

Mayor and Council hope everyone was able to enjoy the May long weekend and took advantage of the nice weather! Various bugs and insects are out in full force right now. We'd like to remind everyone to please be cautious of ticks outside. If you have a pet that has been outside for awhile or playing in long grass, be sure to inspect them for ticks; if you've been outside and in the long grass, it is always a good idea to give yourself a self check to prevent tick bites.

We've officially began the process of updating our Economic Strategic Plan and creation of a Community Improvement Plan. Members from both N1 Solutions and Fotenn travelled to the Municipality at the end of April and beginning of May to meet with staff to discuss the project as well as view the community outlook in person. A public presentation will be available around October of this year, if you have any questions regarding these plans, please reach out to municipal staff at 807-227-2633.

Mayor and Council met in May to finalize the 2023 budget. There were many discussions on each department/budget category; we wanted to be as realistic as possible for our budget numbers and settled on a tax increase of 3%. The total tax revenue taken this year is \$2,132,556. There are certain programs the Municipality is required to allocate money towards. These include: KDSB (\$322,716), Policing (\$233,000), Home for the Aged (\$158,650), and Public Health (\$45,000). These programs combine for 35% of our tax revenue. The rest is spread across various other areas of the municipal budget; including, but not limited to: Administration, Public Works, Arena, Parks, etc.

Mayor Griffiths and our Economic Development Officer met with staff from Minister David Piccini's office in May. Minister Piccini is the minister for the Ministry of Environment Conservation and Parks. At the NOMA meeting in April, Mayor Griffiths brought up issues with our landfills and we would like to talk with the Minister more in depth about them. At the meeting in May, municipal landfill issues were discussed including finding alternative dumping methods for building materials. Also discussed were the problems/roadblocks that the ministry has created on the Ely Lake Cottage Lots Development project, specifically regarding the Lakeshore Capacity Assessment. Unfortunately, there are a lot of red tape issues that get in our way of progressing our projects. Having communication with the Ministry and Ministers is extremely important to keep moving forward.

Economic Development:

I'm starting again with some bad news; we were declined funding through the Ontario Trillium Foundation Resilient Communities Fund. The reason we were declined is because we were successful in acquiring the first round of funding though this program. The two rounds of funding had close deadlines and we chose to apply for two different projects in case we were not successful with the first round of funding. The project that was declined was the feasibility study to assess the possibility of adding a roof structure and concrete surface to the Eagle River Rink. Obviously, we are disappointed that this was declined; however, we now have an idea of what the study would cost and scope of work for the project which means we are shovel ready for future funding opportunities where this project is eligible.

We are still working away on the Ely Lake project, specifically the Lakeshore Capacity Assessment. This is a requirement that the Ministry of Environment, Conservation, and Parks says is mandatory for us to complete. The ministry recommends that a consultant carry this work out but to save costs and time we are completing this assessment in house. Right now, we're at the point where one calculation is left to complete the assessment; this calculation requires years of sampling and is not something we believe is relevant to this project. We are fighting with the ministry to drop this calculation. Mentioned previously was this issue being brought up with the Minister's office. We are optimistic and hope to make some progress on this subject.

Lastly, I'd like to point out that we have many projects that are on the go and our communication with the public can get distorted. A great way to keep up with everything is by attending council meetings or reviewing the minutes of the meetings on our website. If you have any questions, concerns, or suggestions, please don't hesitate to give me a call at 807-227-3005. We are ultimately trying to do what's best for the Municipality and our community. Everyone should feel welcomed and comfortable with asking about what we're doing or expressing their issue/issues with it.

Camping Safety Tips

Campfires must follow all of MNR Fire's regulations. You are responsible for the fires you start. Never burn when it's windy. Only start a fire when the conditions allow the fire to burn safely. Choose a site that is:

close to water source and sheltered from the wind, bare rock or dirt, in an open area at least 3 metres from overhanging branches and vegetation and at least 1m away from any flammable materials. Prepare the site by:

clearing a space about 2 metres wide, removing all debris and vegetation, and ensuring you have a pail of water and shovel to control the fire.

Keep your fire small to a maximum of 1 metre high and 1 metre wide. Small fires are safer, easier to control and easier to put out.

Always ensure children are with an adult around a fire.

To put the fire out:

Pour lots of water on the campfire, stir the ashes with a stick, pour more water over top of the campfire, stir the ashes with a stick again.

Repeat until:

the ashes are cold to the touch, the ashes don't hiss, no more smoke comes from the ashes. Never leave a campfire unattended. You are responsible for tending your campfire, ensuring it is kept under control and for putting it out. MNR Fire investigates all forest fires to determine the cause. If you cause a wildland fire, you can be charged and may be held responsible for the cost of putting out the fire.

When using an extension cord, ensure that it is in good condition, suitable to handle the load placed upon it, and that the outlets are protected from moisture.

When using propane appliances or heater, never use inside a tent or other enclosed space. Without adequate venting, propane appliances can rapidly produce dangerous levels of carbon monoxide (CO).

Camping with an RV or camper:

It is the law to have a working smoke alarm. If the RV or camper has a fuel-burning appliance, you must have a working carbon monoxide alarm as well.

Have a certified contractor inspect and maintain the propane equipment annually.

Before driving, turn off all propane-powered appliances and the propane tank.

Use only designated spaces outside the RV for storage and transportation of gas cylinders, relief valves, regulating equipment, flammables, etc.

Before using propane stoves and heaters, ensure that they are properly connected, as connections may loosen during travel.

Store all combustibles well away from the kitchen area.

Never block the escape routes, everyone needs to have a clear path to quickly evacuate in the case of an emergency.

Never block the combustion exhaust vent.

When using the stove, open the overhead vent or turn on the exhaust fan and open a window.

Do not use the stove as a heat source.

Spring has arrived and with it comes the urge to renovate your home or perhaps start a new build. As a Municipality of Machin resident, it is your responsibility to acquire a building/demolition permit **before** you start your building/demolition project. It is also your responsibility to be aware of the Machin Zoning Bylaws.

The following is a list of items to help you determine whether a permit would be required for a renovation project in the Municipality of Machin:

• Constructing accessory buildings with an area of more than 15 square metres (160 square feet), or an addition to an existing building

- Constructing attached or detached garages
- Structural alterations
- Excavating, repairing, or underpinning a foundation
- Heating ventilation, air conditioning, plumbing, or electrical work
- Constructing one or more new separate dwelling units within a building
- Finishing previously unfinished spaces within a building
- Adding new entrances or windows, changing the size of entrances or windows, or closing entrances or windows
- Constructing chimneys or fireplaces
- Installing swimming pool enclosures, constructing detached decks more than 60.96 centimetres (24 inches) above ground, or building any deck attached to a building.
- Demolishing or relocating all or part of a building.

You are not required to obtain a permit for these renovations:

- Replacing stucco, siding, or shingles with the same material
- Replacing doors or windows without altering the opening,
- Constructing fences (except pool enclosure fences)
- Patching, painting, and decorating
- Installing cabinets or shelves

Prefabricated accessory buildings are becoming more and more popular, and they do require a permit when over 15 square meters in size. These types of buildings have usage limitations in the Ontario Building Code and in the Machin Zoning Bylaw.
