#### **Municipal Notes**

#### **COUNCIL NEWS**

Mayor and Council hope everyone was able to spend time with their friends and loved ones on Family Day! We'd like to thank arena staff for working and hosting the Free Public Skate at the Woodland Arena on Family Day. Thank you to everyone who attended!

On February 8<sup>th</sup> our Mayor and EDO travelled to Kenora to meet with Minister Greg Rickford, Minister Kevin Holland, and Minister Steven Clark. The meeting included other small municipalities with a population under 1500 in the Kenora and Rainy River district. Many different issues were discussed; each municipality was given the opportunity to speak to the Ministers and highlight their own municipal affairs. At the end of the meeting, the consensus was that meetings like this need to take place more frequently. Municipalities in northwestern Ontario, especially smaller ones like ourselves, need to be able to have direct conversation with Ministers to voice our opinion.

Updating our previous Messenger, Nelson Architecture travelled to the Municipality in February to meet with our Mayor, Staff, KDSB Staff, and KDSB EMS Staff. The meeting was for the Feasibility Study/Cost Projection for an EMS Base/Health Clinic; although it was just an introduction meeting, it was one that left us feeling excited to take on this project and see the end result. It is a long journey ahead to where we want to be; we are happy to be taking the first steps to get there!

As residents are aware, we apply for a variety of different grants led by our EDO, we'd like to update the public on how 2021 and 2022 went. Between 2021 and 2022 the Municipality applied for a total of 15 grants, 8 of which were approved, 5 were declined, and we still have 2 grants pending an answer. The total grant money received from these years was \$544,311.86. The Municipality contributed \$85,352.45 to the grants which means that we had close to 86% of project costs covered through grants! We will continue to take advantage of funding programs as they come out and hope to build on our progress these last two years.

#### **Economic Development:**

I am happy to say the Economic Development Committee members have been approved by Council. There are still a few spots remaining so if you're interested, please reach out to <a href="mailto:economicdevelopment@visitmachin.com">economicdevelopment@visitmachin.com</a> or call 807-227-2633 extension 23.

To follow up Councils grant update, we applied to the Ontario Trillium Foundation at the beginning of February for costs to complete a Feasibility/Cost Study at the Eagle River rink. The goal would be to analyze the current services/set-up and provide a variety of different options for the rink moving forward. The study would look into upgrading the rink infrastructure so that the rink was operating each year as well as provide the costs of the upgrades.

In other grant news, FedNor has let the Municipality know that our grant to update our Economic Strategic Plan and complete a Community Improvement Plan has been approved! I'm currently working on drafting an RFP for the project. The end goal would be a new Economic Development road map set out to follow and a CIP that looks to add investment and revitalization to our area!

The survey instructions have finally come in! MNRF has let Machin and TBT Engineers know that the Vermilion Bay North Cemetery expansion property survey can now go ahead. Once we have more snow melt TBT E will be able to tackle this project. Afterwards we will look to finalize the disposition process.

#### To Best Protect Your Family & Home...

For smoke and CO alarms to do their job, they must be functioning properly. Smoke alarm and carbon monoxide alarm batteries should be changed at least once each year for them to remain in optimal working condition. After inserting new batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, make sure that they are working by activating the safety test button. An easy way to remember to change the batteries, is to change the batteries when changing clocks on March 12<sup>th</sup>.

Working smoke alarms must be installed on every storey of your home and outside all sleeping areas. For best protection, install smoke alarms in every bedroom. If your home has a fuel-burning appliance, a fireplace or an attached garage, install a carbon monoxide alarm adjacent to each sleeping area. For added protection, install a carbon monoxide alarm on every storey of your home.

Test all smoke and carbon monoxide alarms each month. Help your alarms remain sensitive and ready to protect you by removing dust and cobwebs from them. If your alarms have been accidently painted or contaminated, replacement is necessary. Also, check the date on all smoke and carbon monoxide alarms. Alarms have a limited life, and they need to be replaced every 10 years. If you have any doubt regarding the working condition of a smoke or carbon monoxide alarm, it should be replaced.

If the smoke alarm sounds, fire and smoke can travel so quickly that every second counts. To survive a fire: Design and practice an escape plan with everyone in the household. Realism is essential to the plan, as is a clear designation of a meeting for everyone to gather outside the home. Make sure everyone in household recognizes the sound of your home's smoke alarm and CO alarm and knows to respond to its signal immediately. Always keep all exits easily accessible and windows able to open freely. For windows that are higher off the ground, consider purchasing collapsible emergency escape ladders.

If a smoke alarm sounds, don't delay! **Get out quick and stay out!!** Quickly gather at a designated meeting place and then call 9-1-1 from outside.

To reduce the risk of CO build-up, keep chimneys and intake/exhaust vents for furnaces and heating appliances free of debris, ice and snow accumulations; only burn dry, well-seasoned wood in fireplaces and woodstoves; and open the flu before using a fireplace for adequate ventilation. Never use barbeques inside garages and never run a vehicle or other fueled engine or motor inside a garage, even if the garage doors are open. If the carbon monoxide alarm sounds:

If you or other occupants are suffering from symptoms of CO poisoning – flu-like symptoms, without a fever, a headache, nausea, dizziness, confusion, drowsiness, or loss of consciousness, get everyone out of the home immediately. Call 9-1-1 from outside.

If no one is suffering from symptoms of CO poisoning, check to see if the battery needs to be replaced or if the alarm has reached its end-of-life before calling 9-1-1.


