# **Municipal Notes**

# **COUNCIL NEWS**

We hope everyone enjoyed Good Friday and Easter Sunday last month and were able to spend it with family and friends. Mayor and Council are happy to announce the sale of municipal property located on Friendship Terrace Rd in Eagle River. The property sold was approximately 1.24 acres that the municipality acquired in 2014 through a tax sale that had no bids.

Mayor Griffiths, Councillor Peterson, and our Economic Development Officer travelled to Thunder Bay on April 25<sup>th</sup> for the Northwestern Ontario Municipal Association Conference. The Conference ran from April 26<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> and speakers at the conference included: MP Marcus Powlowski, MP Patty Hajdu, MP Eric Melillo, MPP Lise Vaugeois, MPP Kevin Holland, Honourable Greg Rickford, Honourable Steve Clark, and many more. Not only did our Machin representatives sit and listen to the many presentations but they also used the time to meet with Ministers and discuss ongoing Machin projects and issues. Some of these issues included red-tape interfering with current development plans as well as lack of financial support for small municipalities to use towards infrastructure problems.

Thank you to Minister Rickford, his staff, and everyone who attended the special funding announcement at the Eagle River Recreation Centre on April 12<sup>th</sup>. Minister Rickford announced \$178,800 in funding through the Ontario Trillium Foundation to extend our Recreation Facilitator's contract for another 2 years. Included in the funding are costs for Carman Brignall, Recreational Facilitator, to implement new recreation and cultural programs in our area. We are thankful for being granted these funds and are delighted to see what Carman has in store for us the next two years!

Delays in April prevented us from sitting down and approving the municipal budget for 2023. We apologize for not having this completed in April. We want to assure you we are doing everything we can to maximize our budget's efficiency. We have a lot of projects on the go and for many of these we require outside funding to complete; our prior-

ity is making sure your tax dollars are used effectively.

# **Economic Development:**

I have to start with some bad news, we were declined funding on two separate programs: Hydro One Energizing Life Community Fund and the Northwestern Ontario Innovation Centre Rural Innovation Fund. For the Hydro One funding, we applied for the costs of upgrading and making our Pine Tree Park trails more accessible by the government dock. Due to an overwhelming number of applications our project was declined; although not the result we are looking for, we will continue to pursue programs like this when they become available. For the Rural Innovation Fund, we applied for funding help to go towards our current Feasibility/Cost Projection study for an EMS Base/Health Clinic. For this program our application was denied because it did not align with their priority initiatives.

Mayor, Council, and staff met with staff from N1 Solutions and Fotenn for a kick-off meeting to go over the schedule for the creation and implementation of a Community Improvement Plan and update to the current Economic Strategic Plan. Public consultation is a required process of the Community Improvement Plan. Groups like the Economic Development Committee and the Revitalization Committee will be key stakeholders whose opinions will help shape these plans. We've had two Economic Development Committee meetings so far and I've been extremely happy with the attendance and input from all committee members. Right now, we're focusing on developing a mission and vision statement for our committee; topics discussed include improving property clean-up/image, bringing business to vacant properties/buildings, marketing our area, and other goals/issues in our area. I'd like to remind residents that there are spots still open on the committee, we'd like to meet once a month but realize many of you are busy in the summertime. # Be Prepared. Know Your Risks. Emergency Preparedness Week May 7 – 13



# Step 1 – Make a Plan

Thinking about what you would do in different situations and preparing a plan with every member of your family is the first step to being prepared.

Your plan should include:

- A family communications plan Identify one or two out-of-town contacts you and your loved ones can call or text to connect and share information.
- Evacuation Plan In case you are asked to evacuate your home, select two safe locations to go to. One should be nearby and should be outside your local area.
- Safe exits from home make sure everyone in your family knows how to safely exit your home by a main exit and an alternative one.
- Emergency numbers Include family doctor and/or other health care contacts, Poison Control, family & friends who can lend support, insurance, utility companies, etc.
- Utility shut-off procedure Know how to turn off the water, electricity, and gas in your house.
- Important documents Make copies of important documents (insurance information, identification, prescriptions, medical history of anyone with special needs, etc.)

Discuss the plan with your family, so that they know what to do in case of an emergency. Keep the plan with the emergency kit and once a year, review the plan with the entire family and update it as needed.

# Step 2 - Build an Emergency Survival Kit

Your emergency survival kit should have everything you and your family would need to be safe and take care of your-selves for at least three days immediately following an emergency.

#### **Essentials:**

- non-perishable food and can opener (3-day supply, per person)
- water (4 litres per person, per day)
- medication and any needed medical supplies and equipment
- flashlight
- radio (crank or battery)
- extra batteries for flashlight and radio
- first-aid kit
- candles and matches/lighter
- hand sanitizer or towelettes
- extra car keys and cash
- whistle (to attract attention if needed)
- Zip-lock bag (to keep things dry)
- Garbage bags

## **Special Considerations:**

- Items for babies and small children
- Pet food and supplies
- Any other items specific to your family's needs

# Extra Supplies for Evacuation:

- clothes, shoes
- sleeping bag/blanket
- personal toiletry items
- playing cards/travel games

Store the kit in a place that is easy to reach and ensure that everyone in your family knows where it is. Check and refresh the kit twice a year. Check all expiry dates and replace food and water with a fresh supply. Check batteries and replace as needed.

# Step 3 - Be Informed

Sign up for Ontario's Emergency Alerts and learn more about the hazards you can face and how you can be prepared for them. For answers to frequently asked questions about emergency alerts, compatibility of mobile devices and the Alert Ready System go to www.alertready.ca.

Spring has arrived and with it comes the urge to renovate your home or perhaps start a new build. As a Municipality of Machin resident, it is your responsibility to acquire a building/demolition permit **before** you start your building/demolition project. It is also your responsibility to be aware of the Machin Zoning Bylaws.

The following is a list of items to help you determine whether a permit would be required for a renovation project in the Municipality of Machin:

- Constructing accessory buildings with an area of more than 15 square metres (160 square feet), or an addition to an existing building
- Constructing attached or detached garages
- Structural alterations
- Excavating, repairing, or underpinning a foundation
- Heating ventilation, air conditioning, plumbing, or electrical work
- Constructing one or more new separate dwelling units within a building
- Finishing previously unfinished spaces within a building
- Adding new entrances or windows, changing the size of entrances or windows, or closing entrances or windows
- Constructing chimneys or fireplaces
- Installing swimming pool enclosures, constructing detached decks more than 60.96 centimetres (24 inches) above ground, or building any deck attached to a building.
- Demolishing or relocating all or part of a building.

You are not required to obtain a permit for these renovations:

- Replacing stucco, siding, or shingles with the same material
- Replacing doors or windows without altering the opening,
- Constructing fences (except pool enclosure fences)
- Patching, painting, and decorating
- Installing cabinets or shelves

Prefabricated accessory buildings are becoming more and more popular, and they do require a permit when over 15 square meters in size. These types of buildings have usage limitations in the Ontario Building Code and in the Machin Zoning Bylaw. Sign-up/Contact sheet, Safety flyer and Garbage bags can be picked up at the Municipal Office from Monday May 1<sup>st to</sup> Friday the 5<sup>th</sup> during regular office hours 8 a.m. - 4 p.m.; as well on Saturday May 6<sup>th</sup> from 8 a.m. - 1 p.m. at volunteer tables setup at the Vermilion Bay and Eagle River Fire Halls. At the same locations pick-up a Safety Flyer with safety tips to help keep us safe while participating in this volunteer initiative.

Pick-up garbage bags (supplied by the Municipality) for municipal roads (black bags for garbage & clear bags for recycle material). Heavy black bags are supplied by Emcon for cleaning numbered highways (please limit # of bags you take based on what you will fill)

For volunteers who plan to participate but may not need supplies from the pick-up locations, we ask that you contact the Municipal Office ph. 227-2633 or email at <a href="mailto:deputyclerk@visitmachin.com">deputyclerk@visitmachin.com</a> so we can get a better account of how many are participating.

#### **MORE INFORMATION:**

The Municipality has granted permission to bring these bags to the landfill with no charge. Volunteers can drop their bags off at the Municipal Landfills that are open or leave them on the road edges for pickup by volunteers or the Public Works Department. Emcon will pick-up along the numbered highways (heavy black bags).

We encourage volunteers to recycle where possible to help extend the life of our landfills (clear bags). Crush recycle material as much as possible to optimize Blue Box space at the landfills. Clear bags containing recycle material can be deposited directing into the recycle bins at the landfills, any black bags containing recycle material must be emptied into the recycle bins. Where possible separate aluminum pop and beer tins, and beer bottles for a possible refund deposit that can be donated to a local cause (If volunteers feel safe doing so)

Please make sure your bags are visible along the roads but well off the road to make sure they are not impeding the flow of traffic.

If your bags are not picked up by Tuesday May 9<sup>th</sup>, please contact the Municipal Office to ensure they are removed.


