Municipal Notes

COUNCIL NEWS

We hope that everyone has been enjoying the nice fall weather we've been having and the fun fall activities that come with it. For some, these activities include hunting; we would like to remind everyone of the Municipality's No-Hunting areas which can be found on our website at visitmachin.com or you can contact the municipal office. Please also follow provincial regulations by not hunting or discharging firearms close to our residential areas which can sometimes be mixed with large rural areas suitable for hunting. Safe hunting for all that participate!

Council received some encouraging news this month; the Ministry of Northern Development, Mines, Natural Resources and Forestry has granted our request to receive 7 acres of Crown Land for less than market value. The Municipality argued that we shouldn't have to pay market value for land that will be used to expand our Vermilion Bay North Cemetery. We are currently in the process of requesting proposals from Licensed Ontario Land Surveyors; after we have completed this stage the surveying will begin. Once the surveyed plan has been completed and submitted to the Land Registry Office, we will wait 6-24 months for the Ministry to officially complete the disposition process.

Council approved a new rental agreement for the Eagle River Rec Centre which can be found on our website. Rates have increased and we no longer offer hourly rentals. We are trying to get the most out of this facility and believe our new rates are very reasonable. On that note, we're excited to say you can now book the Woodland Arena and Eagle River Rec Centre on our website as well. Payment methods are still the same as before; however, now you can look online to see what is going on at each venue.

We would also like to thank all candidates running in this year's election! We look forward to the election and wish the best to everyone that submitted their name.

Council and staff would like to thank Andrea Hatton for her employment and contribution to our Municipality over the last 3 years working as the Backup Operator at the Water Treatment Plant and supporting the Public Works Department. We wish Andrea continued success in her new career.

Finally, we'd like to give a big **THANK YOU** to all the volunteers who took care of the flower beds this past season. Thank you goes out to: Norbert Bruyere, Caleigh Ross, Erin Leutschaft, Sandra King, Carmene Hampe, Linda Carter and Connie Calvert. We are also very happy to announce that the Volunteer Selection

Economic Development:

We have finally been told that our Phase 2 application to FedNor for the Tourist Lot Subdivision application at our airport has been declined. It was determined that the project did not fully meet the economic development mandate for the Northern Ontario Development Program; this program does not support preparing land for housing development. We tried to bring the program up as a tourist lot program, not a housing program; however, it was not enough. We will now look to explore funding this development on our own. The next big step for us will be acquiring the old Highway 647 that runs through our airport property. We have been fighting our case that we should not have to pay for this portion of the old Highway 647 that MTO owns, and we seem to be making progress on this issue; we will continue to update the public as we move along.

We won't be selecting candidates for the Economic Development Committee until the new Council has been sworn in but we are still looking for residents to bring their name forward. The committee will help implement our strategic plan and review current projects. Ideas like shop local campaigns, pop-up events, land development, and other economic development items are what you can expect to be discussed at monthly meetings. 

Earlier this month, Machin Fire took delivery of a 2023 Ford F450 Type I ambulance to replace our 2000 Ford F350 Type I ambulance. Designated as Rescue 64, this vehicle is used as our primary response unit for medical calls, plus as a support vehicle for fire and highway calls and would also serve as a mobile command unit for any major emergencies in our response area. As such, it is the unit that gets the most use as it goes to about 90% of the calls that Machin Fire responds to.

Rescue 64 carries equipment for treating patients in medical emergencies, equipment that allows Machin Fire to care for and stabilize patients until the ambulance arrives. It also carries equipment to support Machin Fire personnel on fire and highway calls, plus provides a rehab area for personnel. It has 4WD capability, which allows us to reach areas under adverse conditions that are more difficult to access, and that the ambulance service might not be able to get to on their own. The new unit has enhanced capabilities over the outgoing unit as it has a winch, IR camera, an inverter for onboard power, better storage, improved access to equipment and an upgraded stretcher.

The old Rescue 64 has been sold to Domtar for their emergency response team and the new Rescue 64 unit has been paid for in full without requiring any taxpayer funding from the Municipality. The funds are 100% from revenue that MTO has paid to Machin Fire for responding to incidents on MTO Highways. Machin Fire has been saving and building the fund for more than 10 years to be able to pay for the new truck in full.

The new Rescue 64 is now in service, and Machin Fire looks forward to being able to use it for many years to come to support our community in times of need.







Fire won't wait. Plan your escape.

This year's Fire Prevention Week campaign, "Fire won't wait. Plan your escape.", works to educate everyone about simple but important actions they can take to keep themselves and those around them safe from home fires.

Fire is fast! Today's homes burn faster than ever. You may have as little as two minutes (or even less time) to safely escape a home fire from the time the smoke alarm sounds. Your ability to get out of a home during a fire depends on early warning from smoke alarms and advance planning.

Fire is hot! Heat is more threatening than flames. Room temperature can rise to over 500° C at eye level.

It is important for everyone to plan and practice a home fire escape. Everyone needs to be prepared in advance, so that they know what to do when the smoke alarm sounds. Given that every home is different, every home fire escape plan will also be different. Have a plan for everyone in the home. Children, older adults, and people with disabilities may need assistance to wake up and get out. Make sure that someone will help them.

Key home fire escape planning tips:

Make sure your plan meets the needs of all your family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.

Smoke alarms sense smoke well before you can, alerting you to danger. Smoke alarms should be installed inside every bedroom, outside sleeping areas (hallway), and on every level of your home.

Know at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows open easily, even in winter.

Have an outside meeting place a safe distance from your home where everyone should meet.

Practice your home fire drill at least twice a year with everyone in the household. Practice at least once during the day and once at night.

Machin Fire will be doing a Fire Safety presentation for students at Lillian Berg School on October 12th.
