## **Municipal Notes**

#### **COUNCIL NEWS**

It's hard to think that the summer is already over and we're into early fall. This year seems to be going by too quickly! We hope students enjoy their first month of school and wish them all the best this school year.

Thank you to Minister Rickford and Staff for travelling to the Municipality on August 15<sup>th</sup> to announce the official grand opening of the Pine Tree Park Playground and Fitness Equipment. Thank you to everyone who was able to make the grand opening and listen to Minister Rickford talk about some of the history of our area and thank the Ontario Trillium Foundation for their funding to support this project.

We'd also like to thank MP Eric Melillo for making a visit to Machin to take part in the Fish Fry on August 19<sup>th</sup>. Thank you to everyone involved in making that day a success! It was great to see so many people out partaking in a community event and enjoying what our area has to offer.

We've accepted the final documents from Nelson Architecture for the Feasibility Study/Cost Projection of an EMS Base/Health Clinic in Machin. Thank you to the Points North Family Health Team/Clinic staff, KDSB staff, and Northwest EMS staff for taking time out of their busy days to provide opinions and help with this document. There are still more phases we must go through before we see this project completed but this was a big first step. Our goal is to have actual designs built for the building next, once it can be visualized combined with the cost projection document, we are optimistic we will be able to acquire funding to have this facility built.

After many meetings and help from public stakeholders and the Economic Development Committee we have a final draft document of our new Economic Strategic Plan. We are finalizing the document with staff from N1 Solutions and municipal staff before it's presented to the public. Staff from N1 Solutions are planning to present the document at the October 10<sup>th</sup> Council meeting, we will be sending out a reminder on our Facebook page for this date.

#### **Economic Development:**

I have some good news to start off with. We were accepted to Phase 2 writing for two grant applications in the month of August. The first is the FedNor Community Investment Initiative Grant. This grant will cover the costs of employing the EDO position for another 3 years at the Municipality. The cost share is broken down so as each year progresses the Municipality contributes more to the position and at the end of the 3-year contract Machin should be able to financially sustain the position without outside help. The second grant was through the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation's Rural Enhancement Stream where we applied for the costs of installing a new hot water system at the Woodland Arena. We were notified we can move onto the next part of the application which will be submitted at the beginning of September. This project is the same that we applied to the Ontario Trillium Foundation for in June of this year. We are applying again so that we have a back-up plan in case we are not successful with the Ontario Trillium Foundation application.

We were given good news from the Ministry of Environment, Conservation, and Parks at the end of August. As you may know, we've been going back and forth with Ministry staff about the Lakeshore Capacity Assessment and the relevance to the Ely Lake Cottage Lot Development Project. We made it clear that we have to complete the assessment on our own since we don't have the funds to hire a consultant to complete the work. At the end of August, the Ministry informed us they are taking dissolved oxygen samples for lakes in our area and have added Ely Lake to the list. After the results are confirmed, we can plug the numbers into our Lakeshore Capacity Assessment and hopefully move forward on this project.

Municipal staff and public stakeholders have been working hard with N1 Solutions and Fotenn to complete our Economic Strategic Plan and Community Improvement Plan. Both documents will be presented by mid-October. The Economic Strategic Plan will be on October 10<sup>th</sup> at our Council meeting and our Community Improvement Plan at the end of September. The Community Improvement Plan will be a public meeting most likely held at the Eagle River Recreation Centre and open to all residents. Staff from Fotenn and N1 Solutions will present the document and open the floor to the public for questions or concerns.

Thank you to those who have volunteered to help with the Junior A hockey games this year! We still need a few more volunteers to help with the penalty boxes, scorers' sheet, and timeclock for the season. We are hoping to have the finalized schedule this month. If you're interested in volunteering, please call 807-227-3005.

Need a Ride to Dryden?

Try Out Our Seniors Bus.

This is a Door to Door Service – you do not have to worry about parking or walking. We drop you off right at the door of your medical appointment or essential shopping and return to pick you up.

The cost is \$10.00 per person to ride to and from Dryden on Tuesday or Thursday. Should you have mobility issues both getting on and off the bus or shopping and carrying your items, thanks to the Happy Go Lucky Seniors Club they have provided funding for an Assistant to ride on the bus to help with these issues. You do not have to be a senior to use this service. Any adult can ride, however seniors do come first for this service.



#### Carbon Monoxide (CO) And Heating Safety

When a fuel-burning appliance does not get enough fresh air and fails to completely burn its fuel, carbon monoxide (CO) is produced. The symptoms of CO poisoning are similar to the flu – nausea, headache, burning eyes, confusion, and drowsiness – except there is no fever. If symptoms appear, immediately get everyone outside to fresh air and call 911.

Heating systems that burn fuel (furnaces and fireplaces) need to be inspected and maintained annually. Be sure to only use a certified heating contractor for the inspection and any required repairs. To check if a contractor is certified or to find a certified technician, check COSafety.ca.

Examine the heating system occasionally for signs of deterioration, such as water stains, corrosion, or leakage. Look for corrosion or rust on the outer shell of a metal chimney. Watch for bulges or corrosion of the liner as well. Loose bricks, crumbling mortar, dark stains, and white powder all indicate problems with a masonry chimney, which should be repaired immediately by a certified heating contractor or mason. Check stove pipes and connections. Ensure that screws are located at every joint and that each connection is a tight, secure fit. Also, look for signs of dark staining or white powder at every joint. Rust is a clear sign that it is time to replace the stove pipe. Check walls for excessive heat. If the wall above the fireplace or wood stove gets very hot, it could be a sign of an improper chimney installation and a potential fire hazard.

Clean the furnace air filters in forced-air systems frequently, at least twice a heating season.

Keep the area around the furnace free from chemicals and materials that could catch fire or explode if they become too hot.

Ensure air exchange vents are free of debris and not blocked or covered.

Keep chimneys and vents for furnaces, heating appliances, fuel-burning appliances, and dryers free of debris and kept clear of snow and ice to reduce the risk of carbon monoxide build-up.

Burn dry, well-seasoned wood in fireplaces and woodstoves to reduce the risk of excessive creosote build-up in chimneys.

Open the flu before using a fireplace for adequate ventilation.

Protect walls and floors from heat and sparks. Always use a properly fitted fire screen around the fireplace, keep combustible objects away from wood stove or fireplace and protect floors and walls with non-combustible shields.

Allow ashes from your fireplace or woodstove to cool before emptying them into a metal container with a tight-fitting lid. Keep the container outside.

Keep children away from the glass barrier around a gas fireplace. It takes an average of 45 minutes for the glass barrier of a gas fireplace to cool sufficiently after a fire has been extinguished. Even the heat from the ignition light can be enough to heat the glass barrier enough to cause a burn.

Keep space heaters at least one metre (3 feet) away from anything that can burn. Never use an electrical space heater in an area that can be exposed to water. Never use fuel-burning portable space heaters in an enclosed space.

Make sure everyone in house knows to get out and stay out and where to meet outside if the alarm sounds.

Working smoke alarms must be installed on every storey of home and outside all sleeping areas. If home has a fuelburning appliance, fireplace or attached garage, a working carbon monoxide alarm must also be installed on every storey of home and outside all sleeping areas.

Regarding renovating your home or perhaps new build, as a Municipality of Machin resident, it is your responsibility to acquire a building/demolition permit **before** you start your building/demolition project. It is also your responsibility to be aware of the Machin Zoning Bylaws.

The following is a list of items to help you determine whether a permit would be required for a renovation project in the Municipality of Machin:

• Constructing accessory buildings with an area of more than 15 square metres (160 square feet), or an addition to an existing building

- Constructing attached or detached garages
- Structural alterations
- Excavating, repairing, or underpinning a foundation
- Heating ventilation, air conditioning, plumbing, or electrical work
- Constructing one or more new separate dwelling units within a building
- Finishing previously unfinished spaces within a building
- Adding new entrances or windows, changing the size of entrances or windows, or closing entrances or windows
- Constructing chimneys or fireplaces

• Installing swimming pool enclosures, constructing detached decks more than 60.96 centimetres (24 inches) above ground, or building any deck attached to a building.

Demolishing or relocating all or part of a building. You are not required to obtain a permit for these renovations:

- Replacing stucco, siding, or shingles with the same material
- Replacing doors or windows without altering the opening,
- Constructing fences (except pool enclosure fences)
- Patching, painting, and decorating

#### Installing cabinets or shelves

Prefabricated accessory buildings are becoming more and more popular, and they do require a permit when over 15 square meters in size. These types of buildings have usage limitations in the Ontario Building Code and in the Machin Zoning Bylaw. Do you need your water tested for lead?

The most common sources of lead in drinking water have been found in lead pipes, faucets, and plumbing fixtures. Certain pipes that carry drinking water from the water source to the home may contain lead. Household plumbing fixtures, welding solder, and pipe fittings made prior to 1986 may also contain lead. Because no safe blood level has been identified for young children, all sources of lead exposure for children should be controlled or eliminated. If you would like to have your household tested for lead, please contact Shawna Alberts at the Vermilion Bay Water Treatment Plant (227-2064) and you will be added to a list to be sampled in 2023.
