Municipal Notes

COUNCIL NEWS

We hope everyone had a wonderful summer. As students head back to school, we wish them all the best for a successful year ahead. Here's to enjoying a long, beautiful fall before winter arrives!

The Municipality is ramping up the use of our Geographic Information System (GIS) as part of our ongoing efforts to modernize services and improve efficiency. GIS is a powerful tool that allows us to organize, track, and manage information in a way that supports better decision-making and helps ensure that no important tasks are overlooked. Over the past month, we have been working to integrate a variety of functions into the system. So far, we have been able to log by-law complaints, public works projects, infrastructure projects, and several other areas of municipal operations. By centralizing this information in one system, staff can more easily monitor the progress of each project, identify priorities, and follow up in a timely manner. This improved level of tracking and oversight will make it easier for the Municipality to keep projects on schedule while also providing better service to the community. As we continue to expand the use of GIS, it will become an increasingly valuable tool in managing our day-to-day responsibilities and long-term planning. Ultimately, this investment is about working smarter, staying organized, and ensuring the Municipality delivers efficient and effective services.

The Municipality is pleased to share that we recently held our kick-off meeting with the team from Steenhof Mining Services, along with Dr. Gagnon and Jennifer Loewen from the Points North Family Health Team. This meeting marked an important first step in moving this project forward, and we are extremely excited about the progress already being made. Right from the start, the team has been diving into the details, working together on a comprehensive document that will help us better understand the specific needs of this project. By clearly identifying priorities and requirements early on, we can develop a more accurate cost projection and create an efficient, well-structured plan to guide the work ahead. This collabora-

tive approach ensures that everyone is aligned and that the project is set up for long-term success. We cannot say enough about how grateful we are for the ongoing support and dedication from Dr. Gagnon and Jennifer Loewen. Their input and expertise have been instrumental in shaping this initiative, and their continued involvement is invaluable as we move forward. With such a strong and committed team in place, we are confident that this project will bring meaningful benefits to the community.

After some initial frustrations and growing pains, the Municipality is pleased to share that we are now almost fully transitioned to banking services with TD. Like any major change, the process came with a few challenges, but we are happy to report that many of the key issues have been addressed. Previous concerns with cheque processing have been resolved, as well as discrepancies with interest rates, which allows us to move forward with greater confidence and accuracy. In addition, we have begun making use of TD's online services for receiving money, which has already helped to streamline certain processes and improve efficiency. The next important step in this transition will be to begin utilizing online payment services, such as direct deposit and electronic funds transfers (EFTs), for sending payments. This will further modernize our financial practices and provide both convenience and reliability for the Municipality and those we work with. We extend our thanks to staff for handling the transition professionally and for their teamwork throughout the process. We are excited to complete the final steps of this transition and look forward to the benefits it will bring.

Don't forget that the Eagle River Recreation Centre is available for rent for your next gathering, celebration, or community event! Whether you're planning something small or large, the centre provides a great space to bring people together. Rental forms, along with more detailed information about rates and availability, can be found online or by visiting our municipal office. We are also excited to share a couple of new features that make the Recreation Centre even more convenient to use. Free Wi-Fi is now available for all rentals, making it easier to stay connected during your event. In addition, renters now have the option to use our Lucynt projector for an extra fee, perfect for adding something special to your occasion.

Economic Development:

The Municipality submitted an application to the Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF) Seed Grant to support the development of a new youth program at our arena. Specifically, we are seeking funding to cover the costs of offering weekly power skating classes for a full year, as well as two power skating camps. This initiative is designed to give children and youth the opportunity to stay active, learn valuable skating skills, and continue to enjoy time at the arena. With the loss of minor hockey last year, it has become even more important to find ways to keep kids engaged and connected to both the sport and the facility. Our staff did an excellent job last year of encouraging participation and finding creative ways to keep the arena active, and we are proud of their dedication. Building on that success, we are hopeful that this grant application will be successful so that we can launch this new program for the upcoming hockey season. If approved, it will provide an affordable and accessible option for families while ensuring that our arena continues to be a hub for recreation and community connection.

The Municipality would like to extend a sincere thank you to all of the businesses that have so far participated in our Business Retention and Expansion (BR+E) program. We truly appreciate the time and effort you have taken to complete the surveys and share your insights with us. Your participation is invaluable and plays a vital role in helping us understand the current business climate in our community. While we have already had a great response, we still have about half of our remaining businesses to connect with. Over the next several weeks, we will continue reaching out, with the goal of completing all surveys and interviews by the end of September. We encourage all businesses to participate, as every perspective adds to the strength and accuracy of the final report. Even at this stage, we have already noticed some common themes emerging from the responses, which will help us identify areas of opportunity and concern. By gathering this information, we will be better positioned to create strategies

that support growth, sustainability, and long-term success for our local businesses. We look forward to sharing a complete report by the beginning of next year. Thank you again for your support and collaboration!

The Municipality recently met with government representatives to discuss the need for a major infrastructure project within our community. Our first meeting was held virtually, where we were able to provide an overview of the project, highlight its importance, and begin discussions on how to move forward. These initial conversations were productive and gave us the opportunity to outline the key reasons why this project is a priority for the Municipality. In addition to the virtual meeting, I was also able to meet with government workers in person to continue the conversation and go into greater detail about the specific requirements of the project. This in-person discussion allowed us to work through important considerations, address potential challenges, and begin shaping a clearer path toward getting the project started. While we are not yet able to release specifics about the project publicly, we want to assure residents that it is a meaningful step forward for our community's long-term infrastructure planning. We are excited about the progress being made and look forward to the day when we can share more details. Completing this project will be a significant achievement, crossing a major item off our list of future infrastructure priorities. It represents an important investment in our community's growth, safety, and sustainability, and we are eager to continue working with our government partners to bring it to life.

Public Works:

The Municipality would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to our summer student, Courtney Reimer, for all of her hard work and dedication throughout the season. Courtney has been a tremendous help to our team, and we are very grateful for the effort and enthusiasm she brought to her role. We wish her all the best as she continues her studies and future endeavors.

Looking ahead, the Municipality is excited to share that we are currently looking to hire a Public Works Working Foreman Intern for a one-year contract position. This is a great opportunity for someone interested in gaining valuable experience while contributing to important municipal projects and services. Anyone interested in learning more about the role is encouraged to reach out to our office for additional details. We look forward to welcoming a new

team member to continue supporting the needs of our community.

Carbon Monoxide and Heating Safety

Carbon monoxide (CO) is an **invisible, odorless, tasteless** and poisonous gas produced by fuel-burning appliances and equipment. When a fuel-burning appliance does not get enough fresh air and fails to completely burn its fuel, carbon monoxide is produced.

The symptoms of CO poisoning are similar to the flu – nausea, headache, burning eyes, confusion and drowsiness – except there is no fever. If symptoms appear, immediately get everyone outside to fresh air and call 911.

To keep your home safe from carbon monoxide, eliminate CO at the source. Have your home's fuel-burning appliances and equipment inspected annually by a certified technician. The inspection should include all fuel-burning appliances/equipment and their systems, such as the fuel supply, chimney/venting system and area around the device. To find a TSSA-registered contractor, visit COSafety.ca

In addition to an annual inspection, occasionally examine your heating system for signs of deterioration, such as water stains, corrosion or leakage.

For forced-air systems, clean the furnace air filters frequently – at least twice a year.

Keep the area around the furnace free from dust, lint and materials or chemicals that could catch fire or explode if they become too hot.

Houses need to “breathe”. They need to expel moisture and other gases from inside and take in fresh air from outside. If the home's ventilation is damaged or blocked, there is a powerful exhaust fan or there is an open-hearth fireplace, then carbon monoxide can be drawn back inside the house. To prevent CO being drawn back into the house, make sure warm-air outlets and cold-air outlets are not covered by furniture or debris and check that the chimney and all vents to outside are free of debris and that they are kept clear of snow and ice buildup throughout the winter.

If home has a fuel-burning appliance, fireplace or attached garage, a working CO alarm must be correctly installed on every level of your home and near sleeping areas.

Working smoke alarms must be correctly installed on every story of home and outside all sleeping areas.

Test your CO and smoke alarms once a month to verify that that are working properly.


